## ...And Then There Were Seven

A story of love. Doug and Carrie Stonebarger became foster parents for twin boys, Isaiah and Gabriel, on July 11, 2007. They were a little over a year old at the time. Their mother was pregnant with their sister, Gwenith and were able to keep her for about 10 months but DFS became involved with the family again and Gwenith was brought to the Stonebargers to keep the siblings together. After many unsuccessful attempts to work with the children's parents the process was started to terminate the parents' rights in January, 2009. In August, the judge finally rendered his decision on the case and terminated the parents' rights. That made the children eligible for adoption. When the Stonebargers were asked if they wanted to adopt the children there was no hesitation. By then, Carrie said, "they were already Mom and Dad to them and they were our kids." It took five months to take care of all of the legal paperwork. On December 22nd, the Stonebargers appeared before the judge in the courtroom with the three children and it became official. Isaiah, Gabriel and Gwenith were now Stonebargers. What a Christmas present! Just in time for Christmas! Doug and Carrie now officially have 7 children: Tiffany 15, Stephanie 12, Jacob 10, Douglas 7, Isaiah 3, Gabriel 3, and Gwenith 2. Carrie says, "The kids keep us on our toes but we love them all and I wouldn't have it any other way. We are definitely BLESSED!"
