Warren County Sheriff Kevin Harrison reports the arrests of three local suspects on charges of manufacturing methamphetamine, distribution of methamphetamine, and three counts of endangering the welfare of a child. The suspects were identified as:

On November 24, 2012 at approximately 6:17am Deputies Amber Dreher and Michael Hernandez were dispatched to the area of Abrolat Road for a 911 cell phone hang-up call. Dispatch was able to hear what sounded like a disturbance in the background. 911 calls initiated from cellular phones normally return GPS coordinates of the caller instead of a physical street address like a residential landline. Deputies began conducting a house to house canvas in an attempt to locate the origins of the call, and determine if somebody was in need of assistance. Upon arrival at the 23000 Block of Abrolat Road the deputies could detect the odor of starting fluid that appeared to be originating from inside the residence. They also observed a burn pile in the back yard that contained Coleman Fuel containers and stripped lithium batteries. These items and odors are commonly associated with the clandestine manufacturing of methamphetamines. The deputies made contact with the occupants of the residence and verified that there was no disturbance in progress, and then inquired about the chemical odors coming from the residence and the items in the burn pile. The occupants refused to give consent to search the residence, so the deputies secured the scene and applied for a search warrant. Upon executing the search warrant the deputies discovered three separate active meth labs in the residence. Three children ages 2, 13, and 14 were also found in the residence and were placed into protective custody and removed for their safety.
