Warren County Sheriff Kevin Harrison reports the arrests of three Washington Missouri teens for burglarizing a convenience store in Marthasville. The suspects were identified as:

On December 8, 2012 at approximately 10:52pm WCSD Deputy Jacob Sprick was dispatched to the S&R Convenience Store in Marthasville Missouri for a report of a burglary.

Upon meeting with the owner of the business Sprick learned that somebody had broken into the store while it was closed and stole over \$500 in currency and an unknown amount in checks. The exact amount has not been determined at this time but it is estimated at several thousand dollars.

After interviewing the store owner and reviewing surveillance video the investigation revealed that an employee of the store (Corey Reiling-Clark) had hidden a friend (Jasper Meyer-Coates) in the cooler of the store prior to closing. Once the store was closed Jasper exited the cooler and went to the location where Corey had hidden the cash and checks. Once Jasper had the money in his possession he exited the store and was picked up by Jacob and Corey, and the three returned to Washington to split up the money they had just stolen.

Jasper Meyer-Coates was taken into custody on December 11, 2012, and Corey Reiling-Clark and Jacob Fuse were taken into custody on December 12, 2012. Deputy Sprick was only able to recover part of the checks. The suspects stated they divided the cash, purchased marijuana, and had a party. They stated the rest of the checks were thrown away. All three suspects are currently incarcerated in the Warren County Jail.
